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The administration has asked the board to approve wearing masks for everyone once school starts. A board member asked if there were any parameters to take us out of the mask mandate. No metrics at this time, but districts are working on them. Mrs. Jiskra is on the weekly calls with the county and MDE, talk about cases per 10,000, to end the mandate the number would need to drop below a certain threshold and stay there. The meeting Thursday will look at threshold numbers. Prior Lake district is also looking at thresholds and will share that information. Their board has mandated masks this afternoon. Mrs. Jiskra shared that the best place for kids to be is in school. By masking, it reduces the quarantine time for students and teachers, keeping them in school longer. The guidelines say to make an attempt to keep 3 feet distance. Board members

acknowledged the passion around not having students in masks. A dozen or so emails were sent to board members regarding this topic. A board member shared that when Aspen was first founded, there was a lot of passion around uniforms, Core Knowledge topics, hiring practices, etc. so they understand people's passion. Aspen is also a school of choice and the board does what they feel is best for the building. Another board member was concerned if masking was a choice, would teachers remember who was wearing a mask when if there needed to be contact tracing done. Seems like a significant loss of time in school was not addressed in emails and it is important for the board to listen to admin. From a teacher standpoint, want the kids in school. Distance learning option – not completely off the table, admin is looking into possible different options, but nothing at this time unless we were mandated by the state to do distance. Mrs. Jiskra shared that Aspen did apply for a provisional online learning license. A board member shared that Prior Lake extended their op-in timeline for their online school. A board member shared that it has been a struggle, attended board meetings for Prior Lake, parent's want the right to choose. They see that throughout the Prior Lake community. Wants what's best for kids, be in school. A board member stated that it is enacting a policy for public places, kind of like a stop sign. With the issue of quarantining, teachers most effective by not having to worry about who was wearing a mask when. A member said wearing masks will also help keep teachers in the classroom. Another member stated that they understand that having a choice would be ideal, but again as with the uniform or Singapore math or Core Knowledge, these are not options for Aspen. Yes, these are curriculum choices and not health choices. A board member shared the example of peanuts in schools, some schools have peanut free areas and children aren't allowed to bring peanuts into school. A communication would go out to parents from administration, should give reasons, show impact of quarantine. Be prepared for kickback and knowing CDC guidelines for schools.
